## **NOUVEAU CENTRE BUILDING AND RESOURCE MOBILIZATION – REVISION 1**

### **INTRODUCTION**

1. The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has been hosted by the French public authorities since its creation in 1965. For five decades, from 1972 to 2022, IARC carried out its activities at the Grange-Blanche site, located in the 8<sup>th</sup> district of Lyon. The IARC community was housed within the "Tower" owned by the City of Lyon, and three additional buildings built by IARC. Given the deteriorated condition of the premises, a technical study of the buildings was undertaken in 2012 to determine their suitability to continue to host IARC activities. The decision was made to relocate IARC, and in May 2014, the Governing Council, in consultation with the French Government, confirmed the relocation of the Agency to the heart of the Lyon-Gerland Biodistrict.
2. The French public authorities agreed on the funding scheme for the "Nouveau Centre" building in 2015. It will be co-funded by the French government (Ministry of Research, Ministry of Health and Ministry of Foreign Affairs), the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region, the Metropole of Lyon, and the City of Lyon. IARC was responsible for the costs of equipping the "Nouveau Centre", including scientific equipment as well as the transfer of all activities to the new premises.
3. As the owner of the building, the Metropole of Lyon signed an agreement with IARC on 27 October 2022 to provide the building free of charge for 30 years, with the possibility of extending. This agreement became effective the day the keys of the "Nouveau Centre" were handed over to IARC, on 28 October 2022.

### **FINANCING THE NOUVEAU CENTRE PLUS PROJECT**

4. As mentioned in paragraph 2 above, certain cost elements of the Nouveau Centre project were identified as outside the scope of the Métropole de Lyon's financial responsibility. These cost elements inter alia include the physical move of operations of a substantial number of biobank samples requiring specialized transportation; the purchase, transport and installation of laboratory equipment and benching; and the installation of specific security requirements as mandated by UN Security Standards.
5. Other potential costs associated with the move relate to modernization to ensure the best possible working environment in the new IARC Headquarters. This includes the replacement of some of the oversized or old office furniture, outdated laboratory equipment, as well as

auditorium and meeting room video and sound systems. The Agency would also like to take this opportunity to replace old freezers in the biobank and transition to a modern, automated system.

6. As mentioned in [Document GC/64/7](#), the overall investments for a fully operational modern, smart and open building originally estimated at €13.4 million, were re-assessed in 2021 to be compliant with IARC new Medium-Term Strategy (MTS), and mainly thanks to the hard efforts of IARC Procurement Office to get the best proposals from its suppliers. The overall investments budget was thus readjusted at €8.54 million as of March 2023, which would allow IARC to deliver its full potential and further expand its activities.

7. In early 2020, in order to help the resource mobilization efforts, the Governing Council Working group on Infrastructure requested IARC Secretariat to address the funding gap issue and develop investment prioritization strategy scenarios for all the additional costs of items outlined in paragraphs 4 and 5 above (GC/62/8 – Annex 1 refers).

8. Throughout 2021 and 2022, thanks to resource mobilization efforts, hard work from Procurement Office, and the loan from the Governing Council Special Fund ([Resolution GC/63/R11](#)), IARC Secretariat managed to cover entirely Priority 1 items.

9. Furthermore, at the beginning of 2023, IARC Secretariat also managed to identify funds for Priority 2 and Priority 3 items. Among those, the sale of the previous premises built by IARC, i.e. Sasakawa Memorial Hall, Latarjet and BRC buildings, to the Ville de Lyon, which took place at the end of 2022, and for which IARC Secretariat requests the Governing Council's approval to use the funds to continue to equip and furnish the Nouveau Centre.

10. As of 1 March 2023, the expenditures and budget status to equip the Nouveau Centre is as follows:

## PROJECT TIMELINE

11. The construction of the “Nouveau Centre” was officially completed on 28 October 2022, though providers are still working on several aspects of the building, including the electrical network, ventilation and heating systems, and wall and ceiling finishes. Construction took

27 months to complete (excluding preparation), with the collaboration of more than 60 companies in the region.

12. Despite several delays, IARC’s equipment and furniture have been moved into the new building as planned. This operation included the delicate and technically complicated transfer of the Biobank and its 6 million biological samples, which was successfully completed at the beginning of December 2022.

13. Throughout 2022, IARC Secretariat went through all the administrative and legal procedures to stop the activities in the old premises, to sign the Agreement for the sale of the Latarjet, BRC and Sasakawa Memorial Hall to the Ville de Lyon and finally handed over the keys of the old premises to the Ville de Lyon on 20 December 2022.

14. IARC personnel gradually onboarded the new building between 3 January and 7 February 2023. Colleagues from epidemiology branches and IARC management personnel could restart their work on premises as soon as onboarded. However, at the time of writing this report, most of the laboratory activities have not restarted yet, due to delays in completing essential building works. Indeed, the Métropole de Lyon needs to ensure the construction companies resolve any outstanding compliance issues before the end of October 2023, but from a contractual point of view, critical works should have been completed before the end of February 2023. IARC Secretariat is liaising on a regular basis with all levels of the Métropole de Lyon, involving also the other funding partners, to make things happen as soon as possible. An official letter was sent out to the Métropole on 28 February 2023 hopefully to quicken the process.

15. Nevertheless, the official inauguration ceremony of the “Nouveau Centre” is scheduled on 12 May 2023.

## MAIN FEATURES OF THE NEW HEADQUARTERS

16. The new headquarters of IARC are located at 25 avenue Tony Garnier in the 7<sup>th</sup> district of Lyon. The building is laid out over six floors offering 11 500 m<sup>2</sup> in total, which represents an almost 20% increase in capacity compared to the previous premises. The “Nouveau Centre” will enable IARC to grow: the Agency has the space to increase its workforce to at least 500 personnel, within an attractive work environment.

17. The “Nouveau Centre” is a state-of-the-art building, providing attractive offices, modern laboratories, with a significant investment in new equipment. The building features cutting-edge technologies which will simplify processes and procedures, data management and on-line meetings. It will allow the Biobank to nearly double its capacity, thereby increasing sampling and storage of biological samples for high quality research.

18. The “Nouveau Centre” also represents a welcome opportunity to reduce IARC’s ecological footprint thanks to its eco-friendly design, paving the way to a new mindset. The environment and how the Agency can contribute further to achieving sustainable development goals has been placed on IARC’s agenda.

### **THE “NOUVEAU CENTRE” ECOSYSTEM IN THE LYON-GERLAND BIODISTRICT**

19. The “Nouveau Centre” not only represents the new headquarters of IARC, it also symbolizes the main ambitions of IARC’s Medium-Term Strategy 2021–2025. The architectural concept of the “Nouveau Centre” aims to promote the concept of “open science” as well as enhance collaboration with the local and national partners.

20. The physical structure of the “Nouveau Centre” reflects our values of transparency and collaboration. The concept of “open science” is at the heart of the new building and will allow us to ensure open access to research infrastructures, to scientific data and knowledge as well as open up new possibilities for dialogue and engagement with society.

21. Located in the Lyon-Gerland Biodistrict, the “Nouveau Centre” will contribute to better synergies with numerous partners in research and health. The Gerland Biodistrict gathers Lyon’s leading research institutes (INSERM, ENS, Bioaster...), health organizations (ANSM, ANSES, HCL...) as well as potential private healthcare companies within an attractive ecosystem. IARC already has interactions with these institutions.

22. The proximity of the “Nouveau Centre” to the future premises of the WHO Academy and to the WHO Lyon Office establishes a public health hub on a global scale, the “Lyon WHO Hub”. This hub will allow IARC to share programmes, resources, and service providers, and stands as a unique opportunity for IARC to increase collaborations and partnerships locally and around the world.

### **RESOURCE MOBILIZATION EFFORTS: THE “NOUVEAU CENTRE” FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN**

23. As described during the last Governing Council in May2022, the Secretariat has developed a three-pronged strategy to mobilize in-kind and financial resources for the Nouveau Centre project. All three axes of the campaign have been implemented in 2022, namely:

- A local campaign targeting major donors and key influencers in Lyon and its surroundings.
- An in-kind contribution campaign targeting corporate, for-profit entities.
- A major gift campaign targeting Ultra-High Net Worth individuals (UHNWI) and/or Participating States.

24. During the Governing Council session in May 2021, the IARC Secretariat launched a crowdfunding campaign that allowed individuals to have their name written on the glass doors of the “Nouveau Centre” in exchange for an affordable donation ([isupport.iarc.fr](https://isupport.iarc.fr)). The campaign was publicized internally as well as externally.

25. In 2022 only, the Secretariat was able to raise €19 965.27 from the crowdfunding campaign (see [Annex 1](#)), and also significantly increased its visibility amongst local stakeholders, including the media, large corporations and the general public. This increased visibility will help develop future strategic partnerships with local and national entities and strengthen IARC’s position as a leading international cancer research centre.

26. The campaign also allowed the Secretariat to secure financial donations, amounting to €30 000, from local Non-State Actors (NSA) in 2022. For example, the company Arrivetz organized a charity artwork auction in support of IARC and its Nouveau Centre, raising €16 000. The Secretariat also reached out to many potential donors, organized some charity lunch with Rotary or a visit of the Nouveau Centre with major donors from the Fondation de France for example. This helped increase the visibility of the organization and we are now in contact with donors who want to provide funding for research projects beyond the Nouveau Centre equipment. We have also received donations through the online donation page specific to the Nouveau Centre for a total amount of €1915.37 in 2022.

27. The Secretariat formally launched the in-kind contribution campaign in October 2020 on the United Nations Global Marketplace (UNGM). The equipment needed for the Nouveau Centre was divided into three areas: furniture, IT-audio-video equipment and laboratory equipment. Specific donor acknowledgement guidelines were discussed and finalized with WHO DAN (Due diligence of Non-State-Actors) and LEG (Legal unit).

28. In 2022, the Secretariat secured in-kind donations from eight different companies for a total of €216 240.09. Furniture was delivered in the Nouveau Centre in November and December 2022 and placed in the most visible locations (reception areas, cafeteria, common spaces). More than ninety new height-adjustable desks for the new offices have also been donated. Including the in-kind donations of equipment IARC received in 2021 and the ones to be received in 2023, the Secretariat will have mobilized around €300 000 worth of equipment for the Nouveau Centre.

29. Regarding the major gift part of the campaign, the Secretariat is currently discussing with potential major donors, especially from the Middle East geographic area and from India.

30. The Secretariat has also worked on engaging more meaningfully with potential donors, including IARC Participating States and High Net-Worth Individuals, offering them the opportunity to name a meeting room or key location in the Nouveau Centre. Contributions over €100 000 will be eligible and will be accommodated on a first-come first-served basis. To illustrate the universal mandate of IARC, the Secretariat hopes that some Participating States will wish to name one of these locations after their country, city or even a national scientist who works to advance cancer research. Eleven locations, including meeting rooms and other key locations, have been identified for this initiative. They are distributed as follows:

- One meeting room with a capacity of 100 pax
- Two meeting rooms with a capacity of 50 pax
- Two meeting rooms with a capacity of 30 pax

- One training room with a capacity of 15 pax
- One video-conferencing room with a capacity of 15 pax
- Four remaining key locations: reception hall, atrium garden, cafeteria and the library (the auditorium will bear the name of Dr Christophe Mérieux).

31. In accordance with previous Governing Council discussions, one of the meeting rooms of the Nouveau Centre will be named after Princess Takamatsu.
