

Mission and Scope of the IEC


- To ensure the protection of the safety, well-being and privacy of participants in studies carried out by IARC;
- To enable and promote conduct of good quality research;
- To ensure that Agency's studies demonstrate the respect for the most rigorous ethical principles and standards; and
- To ensure that Agency's studies reflect the values of WHO and of the UN family.

Current composition of the IEC


- Ten senior individuals with diverse backgrounds and nationalities (Brazil, China, France, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Italy, United Kingdom, Saudi Arabia, and Sweden).
- Representing sciences, medical care, ethics, and law.
- The diverse expertise of IEC members ensures the comprehensive ethical review of IARC/WHO research.

IEC evaluations over the biennium

Out of **117 projects evaluated**, **80% were approved**, with **resubmissions dropping by about 50%** compared to the previous biennium.



Compared to the previous biennium, **29.5% more projects** were cleared between meetings via expedited review and notification procedures.



Other activities of the IEC

- Regular update of Standard Operating Procedures to facilitate clearances of IARC/WHO projects;
- Monitoring of potential Conflicts of Interest in research studies;
- Training in biomedical research ethics for IEC members and IARC/WHO staff; and
- Collaborations with WHO, UN Agencies and bioethics networks.
